

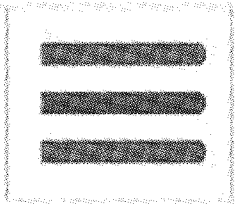

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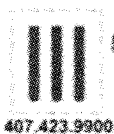
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1 PROCEEDINGS

2 THE REPORTER: We are now on the record. Will
3 all parties, except for the witness, please state
4 your appearance and how your attendings, starting
5 with Plaintiff's counsel?

6 MR. SABARIA: Bryan Sarabia for the State.

7 MR. FALLS: James Falls for the defendant.

8 THE REPORTER: Thank you. Mr. Zweifel, will
9 you please state your full name for the record?

10 THE WITNESS: Daniel Rudd Zweifel.

11 THE REPORTER: And will you please raise your
12 right hand for me?

13 Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the
14 testimony you're about to give will be the truth,
15 the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?

16 THE WITNESS: Yes. I do.

17 THE REPORTER: Thank you. You all may begin.

18 DIRECT EXAMINATION

19 BY MR. FALLS:

20 Q. All right. Good afternoon. My name's James
21 Falls. I represent the defendant in this case. We're
22 present here for a deposition today, 23-CF-562.

23 Could you please state your name and spell it?

24 A. Daniel Rudd Zweifel, D-A-N-I-E-L, R-U-D-D,
25 Z-W-E-I-F-E-L.



1 Q. All right. Mr. Zweifel, have you ever given
2 your testimony in a deposition prior to today?

3 A. For this case?

4 Q. No. For any other matter? Have you ever
5 participated --

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. -- in a deposition before?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Okay. As it relates to the deposition here
10 today, as you can tell, there's a court reporter present
11 who's responsible for taking down the testimony
12 questions/answers. And if there is a time where you
13 respond with a nonverbal answer, like, shaking your head
14 or nodding it, although you and I both know what that
15 means, it may not get captured correctly. So I would
16 just ask that your answers are out loud. As it relates
17 to uh-huh and uh-uh, those also don't always get
18 captured correctly, so I would just ask you to rephrase
19 your answer. Otherwise, if there is anything that I ask
20 you that confuses you and you need me to rephrase it,
21 please just let me know.

22 A. Okay.

23 Q. If there is anything that you simply do not
24 remember, please just say you don't remember. If there
25 is anything that you do not know, either because you



1 didn't see it, didn't hear it, didn't observe it, please
2 just let us know. We would prefer you not to take
3 guesses or stabs at answers that you're not confident
4 in.

5 Otherwise, do you have any questions for me
6 before I start with my questions?

7 A. I do not. I understand.

8 Q. Cool. All right. Taking you back to February
9 9, 2023, do you recall where you were located in the
10 evening time of that day?

11 A. I do.

12 Q. Okay. And where was it?

13 A. In the front of Mike Krnjaich's yard, right
14 near the sidewalk by the tree that's in the part between
15 the sidewalk and the street.

16 Q. Okay. And as it relates to you being there,
17 were you there with anyone else?

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. And who were you with?

20 A. Mike, Will Adams, Sarah Connolly, Amanda
21 Krnjaich, their two children, my one daughter. That's
22 who I remember.

23 Q. Okay. And as the evening progressed, is there
24 anything that occurred that was out of the normal?

25 A. Yes.



1 Q. What?

2 A. A gentleman pulled a gun on us.

3 Q. Okay. Taking you back to the very beginning
4 of the interactions with that gentleman, how did he
5 arrive to where you were located?

6 A. In his car.

7 Q. And do you recall the make, model, or color of
8 that car?

9 A. It's a dark-colored Volvo, four-door, sedan.

10 Q. Okay. And as it relates to how that car got
11 there, obviously it drove, but anything else draw you to
12 that car arriving on scene?

13 A. No. Nothing out of the ordinary.

14 Q. When it arrived, where did it stop, if it did
15 stop?

16 A. The car stopped, maybe, 20 to 25 feet before
17 passing us.

18 Q. Okay. And when the car stopped, where were
19 you looking or what direction were you facing?

20 A. I was still facing the street, possibly the
21 driveway. I -- I don't remember exactly which way I was
22 facing.

23 Q. Okay. And once the vehicle stopped, what
24 happened next?

25 A. Gentleman got out of the car. He was cursing



1 at us and threatening us with various words, and he
2 walked over to the speed bump that we had placed in the
3 road on the opposite side of the street and began to
4 toss it away.

5 Q. Okay. And as it relates to the vehicle's
6 positioning, was it stopped in the appropriate lane of
7 travel?

8 A. I suppose so, yeah.

9 Q. Okay. And just to kind of --

10 MR. SABARIA: Sorry.

11 MR. FALLS: No worries.

12 BY MR. FALLS:

13 Q. To narrow that down, how many lanes of travel
14 were available?

15 A. Oh, it would've just been -- the oncoming
16 traffic lane was still available.

17 Q. Okay.

18 A. So one, to answer your question.

19 Q. So he was not parked in the -- on the wrong
20 side of the road?

21 A. No.

22 Q. All right. When the individual gets out of
23 the vehicle, did you notice anybody else with him?

24 A. I did not.

25 Q. And do you recall what he was wearing on that



1 **day?**

2 A. I -- I remember jeans. I remember a hat, a T-
3 shirt. I -- I don't remember -- I think sunglasses, but
4 I'm not going to guess.

5 **Q. Okay. And when you indicated that words and**
6 **courses were being used, do you recall anything that was**
7 **said?**

8 A. Uh-huh. I mean, I couldn't quote it, but I
9 remember what it was being said, yes.

10 **Q. Okay. And what was that?**

11 A. "You can't put this out here. These things
12 are fucking illegal. You guys should all be kicked out
13 of here," or something like that. Yeah. "You can't do
14 this shit in our neighborhood," or --

15 **Q. Okay.**

16 A. -- whatever.

17 **Q. And as it relates to the speed bumps, were**
18 **they plastic, portable speed bumps?**

19 A. Yes.

20 **Q. All right. And when you indicated that he**
21 **walked to the opposite lane of travel, what happened**
22 **next?**

23 A. As I said, he grabbed the speed bump, began to
24 throw it. Mike, who was one of the people I mentioned
25 was out there, approached him.



1 I think Mike said, "Don't throw my stuff."

2 Gentleman said, "But you can't f-ing and have
3 this out here."

4 Mike pushed him. Gentleman took about a step-
5 and-a-half back and pulled a gun on everyone.

6 **Q. Okay. As it relates to the statements that**
7 **you just indicated were exchanged between Mike and the**
8 **individual that drew the firearm, do you recall anything**
9 **else that was said during that interaction?**

10 A. By who?

11 **Q. If anything, by anybody?**

12 A. Nothing that I could quote.

13 **Q. Okay. And then as it relates to this**
14 **interaction, where were you positioned?**

15 A. If memory serves me, I was positioned about
16 two steps behind where Will Adams was. He was more next
17 to the tree.

18 **Q. Okay.**

19 A. I was probably two steps back, maybe one or
20 two steps to the -- to the left, if we're facing the
21 street. I was basically behind the tree. A tree was
22 here, Will was here, and I was right here, because we
23 were chatting.

24 **Q. Okay. So I'm going to try and put those**
25 **descriptions into words. You said the tree was --**



1 A. The tree would've been probably maybe two
2 paces to my -- in front of me --

3 Q. Okay.

4 A. -- to the left. Will would've been maybe two
5 paces or so in front of me to the right.

6 Q. Okay. So both Will Adams and the tree are in
7 front of you, if your back is facing the home and your
8 front is facing the road?

9 A. Correct.

10 Q. Okay. Now, if you were to be positioned
11 completely straight with your back facing the home and
12 your front facing the tree, followed by the road,
13 followed by the next home across the street,
14 positionally which direction was your body facing? Was
15 it exactly as I just described, or were you turned to
16 the left --

17 A. I --

18 Q. -- turned to the right?

19 A. I don't remember.

20 Q. Okay.

21 A. I -- I was facing the street.

22 Q. Okay.

23 A. I don't remember.

24 Q. And as it relates to the distance between
25 yourself, and Mr. Krnjaich, and the speed bumps, and --



1 where that incident was taking place, do you know how
2 far away you were?

3 A. Within 25 to 30 feet.

4 Q. Okay. And as it starts to unfold, you
5 described Mr. Krnjaich pushing the individual that drew
6 the firearm?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. And the individual that drew the firearm took
9 a step-and-a-half or so back?

10 A. I'm guessing.

11 Q. Okay.

12 A. Yeah. Maybe two steps.

13 Q. As it relates to the firearm being drawn
14 specifically, do you recall where the firearm was drawn
15 from?

16 A. As -- I believe it was his right side.

17 Q. Okay. And do you recall whether it was right
18 front, right hip, right back?

19 A. I don't remember.

20 Q. Okay. And do you recall which hand he used to
21 draw the firearm?

22 A. I believe it was his right hand.

23 Q. And do you recall which hand he used holding
24 the firearm?

25 A. I believe it was both.



1 Q. Okay. Do you recall what color the firearm
2 was?

3 A. I do not.

4 Q. Do you recall what type of firearm it was?

5 A. No.

6 Q. Okay. So if -- are you familiar with the
7 difference between a pistol and a rifle?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Do you recall whether it was a pistol --

10 A. It was a pistol.

11 Q. -- or a rifle?

12 A. It was a handgun.

13 Q. Okay.

14 A. Yes. I'm sorry. I didn't --

15 Q. No. That's okay.

16 A. -- let you finish the question.

17 Q. And then as it relates to the different
18 subsets of handguns, do you recall whether it was a
19 revolver or a semi-automatic pistol?

20 A. Semi-automatic, I believe.

21 Q. Okay. And when you say you believe, can you
22 be more specific?

23 A. I -- semi-automatic. I -- I didn't hold it.

24 Q. Okay.

25 A. I don't know exactly its capabilities.



1 Q. And I guess, if you were looking at a revolver
2 and a semi-automatic pistol, would you be able to tell
3 the difference?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. Just by simply looking at them?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Okay. Taking you back to February 9, 2023,
8 when the firearm got pulled, do you recall whether it
9 was a revolver or a semi-automatic pistol?

10 A. Semi-automatic.

11 Q. Got it. And --

12 A. It was --

13 Q. -- and once the firearm was drawn, what
14 happened next?

15 A. Once it was drawn, Mike, I -- I mean, ran
16 away. Everyone was concerned to protect the children.
17 We didn't know what this person was doing and why they
18 were doing it. The gentleman said something. I -- I --
19 I don't remember what.

20 Q. Okay.

21 A. Try -- I -- I would try to remember. I
22 remember all of us scrambling to try to make sure that -
23 - or they were -- Mike was scrambling with Amanda to try
24 to get the kids away. My daughter had gone over to my
25 house to get her bike because she wanted to ride her



1 bike with the other children --

2 **Q. Okay.**

3 A. -- so she was over there. I knew she wasn't
4 in the line of fire. And then the gentleman who had the
5 gun began pointing it at each one of us.

6 **Q. Okay. And as it relates to what occurred when**
7 **you said Mike scrambled, what did that actually look**
8 **like?**

9 A. He ran away.

10 **Q. Okay.**

11 A. He ran -- I -- I -- I don't remember which
12 direction he ran. I know he ran away from the person
13 with the gun, ran over towards his driveway, and then
14 ran to get one of his boys while Amanda got the other
15 boy to get the -- try to get them to safety before
16 anyone got hurt.

17 **Q. Okay. And when that was occurring, what were**
18 **you looking at?**

19 A. I was frozen.

20 **Q. Okay.**

21 A. I was staring at the person with the gun.

22 **Q. Okay. And in which direction was the firearm**
23 **pointed at when Mr. Krnjaich scrambled?**

24 A. It tracked him until he was far enough away,
25 and then it tracked over to all of us individually.



1 Q. Okay. And describe that with words, if you
2 can, what that looked like from your point of view?

3 A. I was staring directly at the person with the
4 gun as he was directly locked on me, looking at the end
5 of his gun, not knowing what was going to happen. I --
6 I suppose he -- I shouldn't guess. He must have
7 realized I wasn't in any way approaching. So he tracked
8 everyone else in the crowd --

9 Q. Okay.

10 A. -- with his weapon. Pointed it directly at
11 them.

12 Q. And who were the other individuals that were
13 in that crowd with you?

14 A. Sarah Connolly, Will Adams, myself. That's --
15 that's who I remember.

16 Q. Okay. And --

17 A. I believe at that time, Mike and Amanda had
18 retreated to get the kids to safety.

19 Q. All right. And as it relates to the sequence
20 of who the firearm was pointed at, do you recall that
21 sequence?

22 A. Like, who he pointed at first?

23 Q. Uh-huh. Yes.

24 A. I mean, Mike, obviously, was first. I -- I
25 don't recall if he went to Will and then me, and then



1 Sarah. I -- I don't -- I don't remember.

2 Q. All right. And as it relates to Sarah's
3 positioning, would Sarah have been off to your left or
4 to your right?

5 A. I believe she was to my right, more -- closer
6 to the driveway on the sidewalk.

7 Q. Okay. And you indicated that Mr. Adams was a
8 couple paces in front of you, a bit to the right?

9 A. To my right, yes.

10 Q. Okay. Do you know where Mr. Adams would have
11 been located positionally in reference to Ms. Connolly?
12 Meaning was she so far right that Mr. Adams would've
13 been to her left in front of her so that Mr. Adams was
14 splitting you and Ms. Connolly?

15 A. I -- I remember -- I don't remember exactly
16 where she was directionally --

17 Q. Okay.

18 A. I -- I -- I believe she was to my right, maybe
19 three or four paces, probably somewhere in the middle,
20 if you will, between Will and myself. So just in front
21 of -- and maybe one step in front of me, three or four
22 to the right. That's the best I can remember.

23 Q. Okay. And as it relates to the time in which
24 the firearm was drawn, are you able to tell me how long
25 the firearm was out?



1 A. How long it was out?

2 Q. Yes.

3 A. No.

4 Q. Okay. Are you able to say whether it was
5 seconds or minutes?

6 A. I -- I can tell you it felt like a lot longer
7 than it probably was. My guess would be in the seconds
8 category --

9 Q. Okay.

10 A. -- up to a minute.

11 Q. Okay. And what happened after the firearm was
12 pointed in your direction?

13 A. Are you asking after it was pointed at me
14 specifically or after -- because I don't -- I don't
15 recall if it was pointed at me first, Will, Sarah. I --
16 I don't -- I don't remember that part.

17 Q. Okay.

18 A. So after it was drawn at us?

19 Q. Yes.

20 A. At -- at one -- at some point, the -- the man
21 got back in his car. Mr. Clifton got back in his car. I
22 -- I don't know what he did with the firearm. I don't
23 know if he re-holstered it. I -- I don't remember that
24 part. He sat in his car for a while, and then he drove
25 down, you know, two houses and took a left up the next



1 street. Berrypick is the name of the road. And I know
2 he sat up there and waited for law enforcement to show
3 up.

4 Q. Okay. And as it relates to the next thing
5 that you did, what did you do?

6 A. After he left, drove away?

7 Q. I guess, specifically, at a point in time, you
8 indicated that he got back in his car. Did you do
9 anything from the time frame of the firearm being
10 pointed at you until he got into his vehicle?

11 A. No. Nothing --

12 Q. Okay.

13 A. -- I'm aware of.

14 Q. Okay.

15 A. I -- I was pretty much in shock.

16 Q. And once he got into the vehicle, did you do
17 anything?

18 A. I don't remember doing anything. No.

19 Q. Okay.

20 A. Other than possibly retreating back towards
21 the house, but I -- I don't remember. I'd have to watch
22 the video again.

23 Q. Okay. And then at any point in time, did you
24 return home? Did you go inside the Krnjaich's home?
25 What happened next for you?



1 A. At any point in time that night? Yes.

2 Q. Okay. After he got into his vehicle short --
3 or shortly thereafter, do you recall what you did?

4 A. I believe we -- we were on Mike and Amanda's
5 front porch, waiting -- also waiting for police.

6 Q. Okay. Did you call 911?

7 A. I did not.

8 Q. Why not?

9 A. Because Mike did.

10 Q. Okay.

11 A. And I -- I -- I believe the -- Mr. Clifton
12 called, as well.

13 Q. Okay. Why do you believe that?

14 A. I think he said he was going to --

15 Q. Okay.

16 A. -- if I remember correctly.

17 Q. Other than a statement made by him about
18 calling the police and then the other statements that
19 you've talked about today, do you recall him making any
20 other statements during that incident?

21 A. Do I remember anything he said during the
22 incident?

23 Q. At all?

24 A. I -- I -- I stated earlier, I think, some of
25 the things I remembered --



1 Q. Right.

2 A. -- right?

3 Q. Other than those?

4 A. I -- I -- no. I don't recall if he said more.

5 Q. Okay. Did you say anything?

6 A. I think I said, "Did you really pull a gun on

7 us and the kids?"

8 Q. Okay.

9 A. Like, "What are you doing?"

10 Q. Anything other than that?

11 A. No.

12 Q. Did anyone else make a statement, that you can

13 recall?

14 A. No. I don't remember.

15 Q. Okay. Once you're on the porch, did you stay

16 on the Krnjaich's porch until law enforcement arrived?

17 A. Certainly.

18 Q. And then once law enforcement arrived, did you

19 speak with law enforcement and provide a statement?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. And the statement that you provided, was it

22 verbal and written?

23 A. I know I did a handwritten one.

24 Q. Okay. In relation to your home and the

25 incident, is your home in eyesight of the incident that



1 occurred?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Does your home have surveillance footage or a
4 doorbell camera?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And did it capture any of the incident on that
7 day?

8 A. No.

9 Q. Okay. Did law enforcement ask to view the
10 footage?

11 A. I -- I don't remember. It -- my cameras
12 wouldn't have seen it.

13 Q. Okay.

14 A. They're not pointing in the right direction.

15 Q. Okay.

16 A. I -- they -- I think they did ask, and I said,
17 "No, my doorbell has a wall where it's installed that
18 would block it from seeing that side of the road. And
19 the camera I have by the garage is" -- "is my driveway
20 and front yard."

21 Q. Okay. And during the incident, or as it's
22 unfolding, do you recall an individual by the name of
23 Jamie Connolly exiting the home?

24 A. Yeah.

25 Q. And at what point in time do you recall Jamie



1 **Connolly exiting their home?**

2 A. It was right -- I believe, it was as
3 Mr. Clifton was, kind of, leaving the driveway, getting
4 back to his car. But I don't know that I could say with
5 certainty.

6 **Q. Okay. And just a point of clarification, you**
7 **indicated that Mr. Clifton was leaving the driveway. Did**
8 **he walk to someone's driveway?**

9 A. No. This took place right in the front of Mr.
10 Connolly's driveway.

11 **Q. Okay. So in the front of Mr. Connolly's**
12 **driveway, but in the street?**

13 A. I believe when he was with the firearm, he at
14 least had one foot on Mr. Connolly's driveway.

15 **Q. Okay. And at that point, was Mr. Connolly**
16 **still in his home, or had he exited at that time?**

17 A. At which point?

18 **Q. That he had one foot in his driveway?**

19 A. When he had the gun pulled, mister -- Jamie
20 was inside. Mr. Connolly was inside.

21 **Q. Okay. And then at the point in time that he**
22 **did come outside, do you recall where Mr. Clifton was**
23 **with the firearm?**

24 A. No. Not with certainty. No.

25 **Q. Okay. As it relates to the law enforcement**



1 arrival, did you speak to Mr. Adams, or Ms. Connolly, or
2 Mr. Krnjaich, or Ms. Krnjaich about the incident prior
3 to law enforcement arriving?

4 A. Yeah.

5 Q. And what did that conversation sound like?

6 A. "I" -- "I" -- "I can't believe that just
7 happened. Oh, my God. He just pulled a gun," because
8 we were playing with our kids outside. "How could this
9 possibly happen in our neighborhood?" We were all in --
10 in -- in shock. I mean, that was -- that was terror- --
11 that was -- that was terrifying.

12 Q. As it relates to your confidence level in that
13 firearm specifically being aimed at you, how confident
14 are you?

15

16

17 A. Very.

18 Q. And what gives you that confidence?

19 A. I store down the barrel of the gun.

20 Q. Okay. Once law enforcement arrive and you
21 provided a statement, did you have any other
22 interactions with the investigation on law enforcement
23 side?

24 A. Could you be more specific?

25 Q. Did you speak to multiple law enforcement



1 officers that night? Did you speak to them on a
2 different day? Did you have any other participation in
3 their investigation?

4 A. I -- I -- I spoke to one officer that night
5 who asked me to give my statement. There were other
6 officers present who asked questions that I -- I
7 answered. Since that day, I -- I mean, we've had -- I
8 don't -- I don't think I've spoken with other officers
9 since then.

10 Q. Okay. As it relates to your testimony here
11 today, did you speak to Ms. Connolly or Mr. Adams about
12 the depositions?

13 A. We shared what time we all had our
14 depositions.

15 Q. Okay.

16 A. Yeah.

17 Q. And did you discuss what your potential
18 testimony might be today with anybody else?

19 A. No.

20 Q. Okay. Did anyone discuss what their potential
21 testimony might be with you?

22 A. No.

23 Q. Okay. Now that we've had time to ask you
24 questions and you've answered questions, is there
25 anything in your memory that's been jogged or anything



1 that you want to add, as it relates to any of the
2 questions I've asked you today?

3 A. Not at this time.

4 Q. Okay. If I may just have a moment.

5 Did you take any photographs or record any
6 video footage of the incident?

7 A. No -- yes.

8 Q. What was that?

9 A. I took two pictures of his car, one of the
10 front and one of the license plate.

11 Q. Okay. Anything other than those two
12 photographs?

13 A. No.

14 Q. Oh, did you hear anything about the
15 conversation as it relates to Mr. Clifton and 911?

16 A. No.

17 Q. But you did hear him make mention of something
18 of the sort about calling 911?

19 A. I believe so. Yeah.

20 Q. Okay. Were you privy to the 911 call that was
21 placed from Mr. Krnjaich?

22 A. No. I don't -- I don't think so.

23 Q. Okay. So I guess I asked that in a weird way.
24 Was -- did Mr. Krnjaich call 911 in your presence?

25 A. Yes.



1 Q. And do you recall anything that was said when
2 he made that 911 call?

3 A. I -- I couldn't quote it.

4 Q. Okay. Are there any other details that you
5 believe are important that you have not provided today
6 because I have not asked you the right question?

7 A. No.

8 Q. Anything that you believe I have misstated or
9 misquoted in any way?

10 A. I don't think so.

11 Q. Okay. Anything that you want to change about
12 your testimony --

13 A. Nope.

14 Q. -- before we go off record?

15 A. Nope.

16 MR. FALLS: That's all I got for you.

17 THE WITNESS: Okay.

18 MR. SABARIA: No questions.

19 MR. FALLS: All right. So now you have the
20 opportunity to read or waive. Read means that you
21 go to the transcriptionist's office when they are
22 transcribing it and putting it on record and you
23 would get to make comments about your testimony, if
24 you believe they're misquoting you or something of
25 that nature. You'd have to go to their office to



1 make that happen.

2 Waiving means I'm not going to do that, which
3 ultimately does not mean that you would never get to
4 read it again, because you would, if given a
5 transcript, but you just would not be able to make
6 comments on record about what you believe the errors
7 were in their transcription.

8 THE WITNESS: Can I ask you why -- what I --

9 MR. SABARIA: It is up to you. Basically, you
10 trust that she's going to take down everything
11 accurate.

12 THE WITNESS: She's an independent court
13 reporter, right?

14 MR. SABARIA: Yeah.

15 THE WITNESS: Yeah. I trust -- I waive.

16 THE REPORTER: And then do you want to hold off
17 on ordering?

18 MR. FALLS: Yeah. Thank you.
